Do not make it the conscientious duty of any overseer to disapprove of your ministry in order for him to carry out his clearly defined duty of preserving the unity of the Spirit and of the faith in his territory. "And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance" (Acts 2:1-4).

One of the most common misconceptions about the Bible Church is that it had its official beginning on the day of Pentecost, however, the truth is this was only the official beginning of the mighty outpouring of the Holy Ghost. The scriptural account in the book of Acts does not indicate there was any organizational meeting or that any action was taken to set in order and establish the Bible Church on the day of Pentecost. Although the events of that day do not represent the beginning of the Church, we do not belittle or minimize its importance in the Church's history, because it was on this momentous occasion that the Holy Ghost came upon the apostles and the rest of the Church in the Upper Room which empowered them to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Elsewhere in the New Testament, we find evidence that the Son of God Himself came to earth to organize and establish His great Church. In Matthew 16:18, Jesus Christ states, "And I say also unto thee, That thou art Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." In Mark 3:13-15 and Luke 6:13, we find that the Son of God conducted an organizational meeting in which He called all His disciples together. From among these, He chose twelve and "ordained [them], that they should be with him, and that he might send them forth to preach, And to have power to heal sicknesses, and to cast out devils" (Mark 3:14, 15). The calling of the twelve out of the multitude of disciples and their acceptance of the covenant relationship was the organizing or official beginning of the Bible Church known today as The Church of God.

The twelve disciples chosen by Jesus in the Gospels of Mark and Luke would be part of the foundation of the spiritual House that Jesus said He would build upon the "rock." The rock spoken of here is neither Jesus, nor Peter, but is the rock of divine revelation and mutual understanding that exists between Christ and His Church. What took place in the Gospels was in fulfillment of Old Testament prophecies (Isaiah 2:2; Micah 4:1; Psalm 72:16), concerning the establishing of God's Church or, as some

would say, the birthday of the Bible Church. The Church of God was destined to "shake like Lebanon" and "flourish like grass of the earth." The twelve were only the first of many lively stones that would later be added to the growing structure of God's spiritual but visible House.

The Church of God was already in existence since the calling and choosing of the twelve, however, before they could flourish and have incredible increase and become the group later referred to as "... These that have turned the world upside down" (Acts 17:6), and "Christians" (Acts 11:26), Jesus had proclaimed to them, "behold, I send the promise of my Father upon you," and immediately proceeded to instruct them, "but tarry ye in the city of Jerusalem, until ye be endued with power from on high" (Luke 24:49). Luke later writes to Theophilus recounting the Lord's command and promise, "that they should not depart from Jerusalem, but wait for the promise of the Father... the Holy Ghost" which was "power" for them to be witnesses unto Him "both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth" (Acts 1:4, 5, 8). Both in the Gospel according to Luke and in the Acts of the Apostles, the writer verifies that they returned to Jerusalem (Luke 14:52; Acts 1:12), and we are told the Church went into the Upper Room. The number of "names together" or members gathered "were about an hundred and twenty" (Acts 1:15).

It was upon this group in Acts, chapters 1 and 2 (already organized and functioning as an active living organism before the day of Pentecost), that the baptism of the Holy Ghost was poured out in fulfillment of Joel 2:28, 29 when he spoke in the spirit of prophecy saying, "And it shall come to pass... that I will pour out my spirit upon all flesh." Christ had already reassured His Church, "And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you for ever; *Even* the Spirit of truth... I will not leave you comfortless... But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in my name, he shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you... I will send him unto you. And when he is come, he will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment... the Spirit of truth... will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak: and he will shew you things to come. He shall glorify me: for he shall receive of mine, and shall shew it unto you" (John 14:16-18, 26; 16:7, 8, 13, 14).

Jesus made a promise He meant to keep when He said, "I will not leave you comfortless." He never had plans to leave His Church abandoned or orphaned! When He arrived back where the Father was, we can see Him praying the Father to send the Church the Spirit of truth. We can almost hear Him asking the Father to unleash the power of the Holy Ghost upon the Bible Church to enable her with strength and wisdom to reach all nations and proclaim the good news of salvation through Jesus Christ. He was not disappointed and neither was the Church!

The initial evidence of the indwelling of the Holy Ghost was speaking in other tongues as the Spirit gave utterance, and this unusual occurrence attracted the attention of the multitudes gathered in Jerusalem. Jesus told the disciples that they would receive power after that the Holy Ghost was come upon them (Acts 1:8), and evidence of this power is seen in the courage Peter and the eleven demonstrated as they stood together while Peter delivered his message affirming Jesus as the promised Messiah, speaking of His life, death, and resurrection to the masses on the day of Pentecost. As a result of the outpouring of the Holy Ghost (this power for service) and Peter's message, many of the Jews were convicted and sought the Lord saying, "...Men and brethren, what shall we do?" (Acts 2:37). To this, Peter responded, "...Repent, and be baptized every one of you" (v. 38). According to the record, 3,000 souls were added to the Church on that day.

The Holy Ghost came on the day of Pentecost in a sound, to awaken them! He came in a wind, to move them! He came in fire, to enlighten them and warm them! He came in tongues, to make them speak! O, that He would do it all over again! How different we could be if we would collectively make it our goal to continue with one accord in prayer and supplication, tarrying in the presence of God as the early Church did.

Awaken us, Holy Ghost! It is probably no stretch of the imagination to say that too many of us today are sleeping on God, and all the while Jesus cries, "Watch and pray, that ye enter not into temptation: the spirit indeed *is* willing, but the flesh *is* weak" (Matt. 26:41). Paul expresses his support for what Christ says when he writes, "And that, knowing the time, that now *it is* high time to awake out of sleep: for now *is* our salvation nearer than when we believed" (Rom. 13:11). "And what I say unto you I say unto all, Watch" (Mark 13:37).

Almost certainly it would serve the Church well for us to experience the sound and spiritual shock wave of a Holy Ghost sonic boom traveling throughout God's great Church. A sound from heaven that would wake people out of sleep and cause them to be conscious of the day and hour in which we are living. I believe we could stand to have that old-time Holy Ghost wind that comes from heaven to blow upon us, moving us *like* He wants, *wherever* He wants, and as *fast* as He wants. I wonder what wonderful and challenging things could be accomplished at this late hour with the Holy Ghost wind at our back.

Move us, Holy Ghost! We could benefit from this wind blowing upon the embers of our hearts to make every dying fire in every heart a flaming conflagration that would destroy all, if any, impurities found therein. Breathe on us, Lord! Breathe on us! We want, yea, we **need**, the flames of Holy Ghost revival to rise higher and higher in God's Church. If we take the time to pray, He will surely answer.

The Holy Ghost is the breath of God—the wind of heaven, that we need more than anything else. We are thankful to God for all the talent we have in the Church today—talented preachers, talented singers, talented musicians, talented teachers, talented leaders and organizers. However, talent can only get us so far. It is going to take more than talent to get God's work done. It is necessary for us to have Holy Ghost-anointed men and women, no matter how talented they are. Others may not be so talented, but if we have the Holy Ghost anointing, we have what we need to rescue the perishing and truly make a forward move of real significance in the world today.

Let's make it happen through prayer and faith, Church. By the grace of God and through prayer, let's get the atmosphere in The Church of God all over the world charged with Holy Ghost power. His power is transformative, stirring, and refreshing, and it will bring about greater change in every one of our lives. He is the difference maker who changes everything!

Warm us, Holy Ghost! While the world grows colder and colder due to abounding lawlessness, iniquity (Matthew 24:12), and their indifference toward their Creator, our love for God, love for each other, and love for souls must be on the increase. Only that Spirit that proceeds from the depths of God (which is the Holy Ghost) can make us red hot in the love of God. The world has the wrong kind of love about it. Men are lovers of their own selves and lovers of pleasure more than lovers of God (See 2 Timothy 3:2, 4). Self-willed humanity loves those that love it, but the Scriptures ask, "For if ye love them which love you, what thank have ye? for sinners also love those that love them" (Luke 6:32). But the love of God that warms the heart "is rich in mercy, for his great love wherewith he loved us, Even when we were dead in sins" and His love "hath quickened us together with Christ" (Eph. 2:4, 5).

By now we should be alert to the fact that we are daily in need of the Holy Ghost to warm our hearts and fill us to overflowing with God's love so we can obey His Word to "...Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you" (Matt. 5:44), and to "do good, and lend, hoping for nothing again; and your reward shall be great, and ye shall be the children of the Highest: for he is kind unto the unthankful and to the evil" (Luke 6:35). In a world not at all conducive to revival, we must keep the fires stoked or else we will suffer the consequences of spiritual hypothermia. While we may be exposed to the extremely cold spiritual weather of the icy society we occupy, we can insulate ourselves with the Word of God and the radiant

heat of the Holy Ghost. The Word of God is "as a fire" (Jer. 23:29), and we ministers and members can be made by it a flame of fire for the glory of God!

If you begin to shiver and shake because of the cold, realize that spiritual hypothermia is setting in. Get in your prayer closet because communion with the Lord will make the spiritual fires glow. Get over to the prayer house because it is attending church services and having fellowship with the saints that will warm your heart. When you start feeling a bit cold and your spiritual temperature drops, get moving and work in the service of the Lord, and you will find that it will keep the fire burning. Regardless of the conditions about us, if we will gather the firewood (so to speak) upon the altars of our hearts, the Holy Ghost can rekindle the revival fires.

Make us speak, Holy Ghost! In these last days where there is an increase of hostility toward Jesus Christ, the Son of God, boldness will be necessary to live and share the gospel of Christ and tell some poor soul about their need for a Saviour.

As the conflict between the spirit of this world and the Spirit of God deepens, our boldness of speech, seasoned in prayer, must rise. We may not be refined in our manner of speech and some may consider us unlearned and ignorant, or we may have this personal perception about ourselves. We may not be eloquent evangelists, or we may think ourselves slow of speech and of a slow tongue, but God has made our mouths. If we have the Holy Ghost, Christ will be magnified in us and He will enable us to speak of the virtues of God, the love of God, the mercies of God, the cleansing power of God, the righteousness of God, and so on and so forth. He will guide us in our preaching and all other communication we have with souls. He can guide us in the pulpit, in personal evangelism, and in ministering to people in need. Christ prayed to the Father to send us the Holy Ghost and, by that selfsame Spirit, if we will yield ourselves over to Him, we will be enabled to present the whole gospel in a way that reproves the world of sin, righteousness, and judgment.

The Holy Ghost will not allow us to spend time speaking about ourselves or of ourselves, but to speak of those eternal things found in God's Word that prepare a man to live for all eternity in the presence of God, avoiding the eternal flames of hell.

God has called us and set us up as watchmen to earnestly contend for the faith once delivered unto the saints. The Holy Ghost is with us, causing us and making us speak and not hold our peace day or night and in all places. He compels us to make mention of the Lord and not be silent in a day and hour when even some who confess to love God are not willing to embrace or even endure sound doctrine.

Lord, make us speak the things which we have seen and heard!

The company we keep has a great

influence on our walk with God. The Bible warns us, "Be not deceived: evil communications corrupt good manners" (1 Cor. 15:33). Whom we allow in our inner circle can either push us closer to God or pull us away. We see this truth clearly in the life of Job.

Job was a righteous man. When trials came upon him losing his wealth, his family, and his health—Job's allegiance to God was steadfast. The Bible says, "In all this Job sinned not, nor charged God foolishly" (Job 1:22). Even when his wife told him to "curse God, and die" (Job 2:9), he rebuked her, remaining resolute in his faith. But then his friends arrived. At first, they simply sat with him in silence (Job 2:13), which was perhaps the best thing they did. But soon, they began to speak, and their words brought more harm than healing. Instead of encouraging Job, they accused him of sinning, implying that he must have done something to deserve his suffering. Job, who had once endured his trials with patience, began to waver. He started to question God, asking why he had even been born (Job 3:11); why God would try him (Job 7:18); and why he

had become a burden to himself (Job 7:20). Job began to wrestle with deep questions—not because he lost faith, but because of the discouraging voices around him.

This is why it is critical for young people to surround themselves with godly influences. Proverbs 27:17 tells us, "Iron sharpeneth iron; so a man sharpeneth the countenance of his

friend." The right friends will strengthen your walk with God, not weaken it. They will encourage you to pray, to trust God, and they will never push you away from Christ or His Church.

That is why the HYPE Rally is so important. This is not just another event—it is a gathering of young people who are seeking after God, who desire to be surrounded by those who will build them up in the faith. It is a time to form friendships that will strengthen you, not weaken you.

Ask yourself: Who is in my circle? Do my friends push me toward God, or do they cause me to doubt Him? Do they encourage me to live holy, or do they lead me toward compromise?

Job's story teaches us that even the strongest can be negatively impacted by the wrong voices. Let us be intentional about whom we allow to influence our lives. Our Auxiliary Work

The term auxiliaries is one which we use so frequently that scarcely any member who has been in the Church for just a short while does not immediately recognize its meaning. Beginning with the Sunday School in 1906, the Watchers Over Ten in 1916, later to be renamed Assembly Band Movement in 1928, the Womens Missionary Band and the Victory Leaders Band in 1928, and finally the Church of Prophecy Marker Association in 1941—each of these five auxiliaries have been assigned General Secretaries for their promotion, who through the years have done a commendable job.

No one can deny that our Sunday Schools have had a tremendous influence for good upon thousands of lives since 1906. And only God knows how many souls have been kept from going astray, or the large number who have been brought back into the fellowship of our churches, through the efforts of the Assembly Band Movement and the spirit it has nurtured since its inception. In addition to keeping our young people spiritual, think of the millions of pieces of free literature our Victory Leaders Bands have been responsible for printing and distributing throughout the world.

The vast missionary endeavors of the Church just would not have been possible without the faithful labors of our dedicated women who are members of the Womens Missionary Band. The Church of Prophecy Marker Association, in promoting the vision of one Church for all, has kept this message before our people, and many can testify of the effect it has had upon their being settled and established in The Church of God. There have been some criticisms voiced concerning the auxiliaries in recent years, but surely no one can dispute the value they have been in our work. Perhaps the dissatisfaction stems from the tendency to settle into such routine ways of operating these helps which God has given us that they lose their vitality and fail to excite our people. I believe we must admit that this is a leadership problem rather than it being a problem with the auxiliaries themselves.

Some seem to feel that as long as a large offering is raised in a particular auxiliary fund that that auxiliary is doing well. While the raising of funds for the support of our work is very important, at the same time a church could conceivably be the champion fund-raising church in its particular state or nation and yet have auxiliaries that are failing to provide nourishment to the local church.

We need the auxiliaries operating in a manner which brings spiritual excitement and vitality to our churches. They were never intended to provide simply a routine and mechanical way for fund raising. They were accepted as a way of organizing our people for training and for service all right, but such organization does not have to operate routinely. All our efforts must be Spirit-filled if they are to have the effect God intended.

We certainly would not want to be childish in this matter. A child who is given a battery-operated toy, when the power is all gone from the battery, may decide just to discard the toy and desire something new which works. But the problem is not with the toy, but in its power source. Being energized with a new power source, it may operate just as well as it did when it was new. It seems unwise to attack the auxiliaries themselves when they appear powerless and dull. It would be better to diagnose the cause for their lack of power. There is a divine Source of power without which none of them can function as they should.

If our Sunday morning services become dull and lifeless, for example, the solution to this problem is not in discontinuing them, but to find the cause and take whatever action is necessary so that the Spirit of God can breathe new life and vigor into these services. And this is true also with our auxiliary services. Every local service in our churches should be a time that is eagerly looked forward to for spiritual nourishment and refreshing, and I believe it can be just that way.

For this to be, however, our leaders must make adequate preparation, the foremost of which is spiritual preparation. The work of The Church of God is spiritual in its nature, and though some social activity may be in order within our auxiliary gatherings, such activities are no substitute for spiritual services. Social activities do not feed the inner spiritual man.

I am afraid that in too many places the manner in which the auxiliaries are being operated has brought criticism that may be merited. But this can be overcome by spiritually inspired innovative leadership. It is true that this kind of leadership must begin at the General Headquarters level through an inspiration that is prayed down, and this same kind of inspired leadership must be found in the National and State offices. But this cannot replace that inspiration which is to be generated through the local church leaders....



Philippines

On January 18, 2025, my wife Marsha and I embarked on our first International Mission trip together. Although I have traveled regularly to the Philippines since 2019, this was the first time she could join me. It was a blessing to have her along for companionship and to work together for the Lord in the Philippines. Our trip lasted nine days, and we visited three local churches.





After taking one rest day in Manila, we were up at 3 AM to travel by air to the Aklan province, landing in the city of Kalibo, on an island about 320 miles to the south. Here we visited the congregation of Dongon East, Numancia. This was the first of our churches in the Philippines in the early 1960s. The building still has the original pews built at that time, and a beautiful hand-painted mural of Fields of the Wood is on the wall behind the old pulpit. It is a lovely place with lovely people. Pastor John Ballenas and his congregation treated us like family. Special care was taken to ensure

that our every need was met. Filipino hospitality is among the finest in the world! We were blessed to visit several homes and enjoy fellowship and wonderful food with our brothers and sisters. We held two Spirit-filled church services as well. A special thank you to Pastor John and the beautiful people of Dongon church!

From there, we returned to Manila for a short rest before traveling with Brother Gerson Sallo to Calamba City, Laguna, to visit the church there. The church at Calamba City is one of two churches we established on my visit to the Philippines in January/February 2024. We were welcomed by Pastor Nixon Gregorio and members of his beautiful family. After an afternoon of sweet fellowship and many big laughs, we enjoyed another excellent service with the local church family. Though it

was Sister Estep's first trip, it was as if she was with old friends as she and the sisters talked and laughed. It was this way wherever we went. It was a wonderful day, and we hated to leave, but we still had much work to do, so we returned to Manila again.

On Friday, we spent part of the day visiting some places and friends I knew when I lived there with my family in the late 1980s while my father, Donald Estep, was the National Overseer. Old friendships were still sweet after many years, and it gave me joy to introduce my wife to such good old friends. God is good!

That evening, we attended a special prayer service with the members and friends of The Church of God in Montalban, Rizal, an area just outside Metro Manila. This congregation was established in January of 2024 on my trip to the area. Their work had begun sometime before that with only two families. Since then, it has grown into a thriving church with 35 families! To God be the glory! Pastor Melchor Itang and the congregation welcomed us into the time of worship and prayer, followed by snacks and more sweet fellowship. The Spirit of the Lord had moved mightily in the service, and everyone was so excited to spend some time together. Once again, there were shared testimonies, lots of questions, and many moments of laughter as we felt the deep bond of family. The following day, we visited two locations where the local church ministers to neighborhood children every weekend. Each group was at least 50 strong, with beautiful and happy children

learning about the love of God. The young people in charge of this ministry are anointed and determined to win as many as





possible to Christ! We were welcomed by the kids and had a wonderful time hanging out with them.

On the final day of our trip, we attended the first anniversary service for the Montalban church, which was held one year and one day after I had stood in Brother Gerson's garage and organized the church. It was a beautiful service with nearly 100 people of all ages in attendance. God moved mightily in the service, and everyone left there inspired to continue the work.

We visited three churches, seven homes, and attended seven church services on this trip. I preached four sermons, Sister Estep shared testimonies, we presented five new Evangelist Licenses, three Lay Teacher Certificates, and three Lay Minister Certificates, and held a National Committee Meeting (Trustees). Sister Estep was a real trooper, staying by my side through hundreds of miles of airplanes, boat rides, Grab Cars (Filipino Uber), tricycles, vans and buses—smiling and loving every minute. She fell in love with the Filipino people, and they fell in love with her. We enjoyed many snacks and meals prepared with extraordinary hospitality and love. The people treated us like family, and we have missed them deeply since the moment we left. The handshakes, hugs, and smiles were deeply heartfelt and genuine. This was a life-changing

trip, and hopefully the first of many for the two of us together. The Filipino people are vibrant and happy people who have a great zeal for serving the Lord! Please pray for our people there, and if you feel led to help in any way, don't hesitate to contact me. There are many needs, and I can help you to find a way to get involved. May God bless The Churches of God in the Philippines!


THE GLORIOUS CHURCH OF GOD

THE RISING SON OF GOD'S GLORY

"...the glory of the LORD is risen upon thee" (Isa. 60:1).

The previous article in this series on "The Glorious Church of God" was entitled, "The Rising SUN of God's Glory." This article is entitled, "The Rising SON of God's Glory." The first article showed by the Scriptures that, although the glory of God is immutable and does not change, there are various degrees of manifestations of His glory. This truth is brought out in John, chapter 1: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God... And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth" (vv. 1, 14).

Isaiah prophesied, "Arise, shine; for thy light is come, and the glory of the LORD is risen upon thee. For, behold, the darkness shall cover the earth, and gross darkness the people: but the LORD shall arise upon thee, and his glory shall be seen upon thee" (Isa. 60:1, 2). This is a dual prophecy of the First Coming of Jesus after over



400 years of spiritual darkness between the Old and New Testaments, and also of the Arise, Shine of The Church of God out of the Dark Ages (A.D. 325 – A.D. 1903). The writer of Hebrews was aware that there had been various manifestations of the glory of God in the Old


Testament, but he knew that Jesus outshined them all. He wrote, "God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, Hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son... Who being the brightness of his glory, and the express image of his person" (1:1-3). "But when the fulness of the time was come, God sent forth his Son, made of a woman" (Gal. 4:4). How appropriate it was when the angel of the Lord announced the birth of Jesus to the shepherds that "the glory of the Lord shone round about them" (Luke 2:9). It is sad that "the god of this world hath blinded the minds of them which believe not, lest the light of the glorious gospel of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine unto them" (2 Cor. 4:4). However, for those who have believed, thanks be to God, "who commanded the light to shine out of darkness, hath shined in our hearts, to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ" (2 Cor. 4:6).

If the Church is not being preached and taught according to the divine revelation, somewhere along the line we will have to do much of our work over. It is much easier to be thorough as we go along. Jesus did this when He led the apos-

tles to commit themselves as to whom He was. When Simon Peter spoke for the group, saying, "Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God," Jesus declared, "...Flesh and blood hath not revealed it unto thee, but my father which is in heaven" (Matt. 16:17). Then He declared that His Church would be built upon the same divine revelation and mutual understanding.

It was a visible church that Jesus set in order when He called unto Him whom He would, ordained the ministry, gave them their commission, had a record made, and sent them forth. (Mark 3:13-19.) It was a visible church that walked with Him from then until His ascension. It was a visible church that was endued with power on the Day of Pentecost; and it was a visible church that "Went forth, and preached every where, the Lord working with them, and confirming the word with signs following" (Mark 16:20).

All the local churches spoken of, or written to, in the New Testament were visible,



functioning churches, subject to the central government at Jerusalem. Paul and the others set churches in order with flesh and blood members just as we do today. All the teachings concerning the Church's growth, operation, and perfection were

given to visible memberships, either in person or by letters addressed to them at their various locations. For instance, "Unto the church of God which is at Corinth" (1 Cor. 1:20).

History has left us a record of the visible Church of God....


I feel I must repeat that if the Church is not being preached and taught from the viewpoint of prophecy and the New Testament pattern, we will have more and more people who will not understand our reason for operating as

we do. It is very important that the truth of one Church for all, functioning just as it did from the time of its establishment by Jesus until the time of the apostasy, be taught and preached without the slightest compromise or deviation. It is not a matter of being either like or different from the commonly accepted practices among Christian groups. Our concern is to follow the early Church pattern, which God set forth in the law and the prophets.

"But Mary stood without at the sepulchre weeping: and as she wept, she stooped down, *and looked* into the sepulchre" (John 20:11).

Mary Magdalene is one of the women mentioned in Scripture who had a personal encounter with the Lord. We don't know much about her other than what Luke 8:2 says: "out of whom went seven devils." From this we understand that her encounter with Christ was radi-

cal and life-changing, to say the least. This was her point of reference as she witnessed the events leading up to Jesus' crucifixion. The next time we read about her, she is peering into the tomb to discover that the body of the Lord is not there. Her response to this realization is worthy of our attention. Whether or not she fully understood that Jesus must rise again, according to the Scriptures; even if her arrival at the tomb was a final act of service to the Saviour she so dearly loved; instead of going home as the disciples had, she lingered at the tomb weeping and she took another look into it. She saw two angels this time, who asked, "...Woman, why weepest thou?" (John 20:13). After she answered them, they did not say anything else to her. Their purpose for this encounter was fulfilled.

Then she encountered someone she thought to be the gardener, who also asked her the same question, "...Woman, why weepest thou?" (John 20:15). She asks

this unknown visitor to tell her where Jesus is, then suddenly she hears His tender, familiar voice say, "Mary." The only thing that would convert her deep sorrow into everlasting joy would be that voice as of many waters (cf. Revelation 1:15) penetrating her heart as it had the first time she encountered Him. As she recognized Him, she received powerful consolation from a personal encounter one

last time on earth before He would ascend and be glorified in heaven. I'm sure she held onto that moment for the rest of her life.

That is how valuable our personal encounters are with the Lord. They should be experiences that keep us seeking for Him even while weeping, in uncertainty, fear, hardship, injustice, and while walking in the darkness of this world. Sooner or later, in each encounter, the tender voice of the Master will be audible, and our hearts will receive the strength and power needed to go on. God is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him (Hebrews 11:6), and if we continue seeking Him until that final encounter when we meet Him face to face, it will be a wonderful time of rejoicing throughout the unending ages.

I pray that our reflection on the resurrection of Christ this season will renew our joy as never before until that day when He comes again in His glory. It will be worth it all!

Everyone Loves You, Just Keep Coming

My wife Laura and I were married on Long Island in 1981 after meeting at music school. We then moved to Nashville, Tennessee, for songwriting. During our first year there, we worked small jobs as we pursued our dreams. Even though we had been married in the Catholic church, we visited a number of different churches in the Nashville area. Through a series of events in the summer of 1982, I ended up working at a hardware store. The first day I was there, I met a coworker, Steve James. Within five minutes of meeting him, I heard about the Church of God and how great it was. Steve talked about his pastor, Ray Dupre, and about Jerry Campbell. I had never heard of the Church, but this man was excited about it.

Soon Steve and his wife Freida became good friends with Laura and me. We began to spend a lot of time together as our friendship grew. During this time, I met Jerry Campbell and Ray Dupre as well as a couple of others from the local church. The church was located in a south Nashville area called Woodbine. It wasn't the biggest church we had visited or the nicest building. Though we had met Steve in July, we didn't actually visit the church until the Christmas program in December. The program was typical, but (as many have heard about our first visit there) there was a spirit there we had not found anywhere else. I didn't know what I was looking for, but I knew it when I found it! We started attending, and, as we heard Brother Dupre's messages and became acquainted with other folks in the congregation, we started to really feel a connection with this church that we knew nothing about.

A couple of months later, we approached Brother Dupre after service and talked to him about joining. A few days later, he came over to talk and ask us questions concerning the doctrine of the Church. Realizing we were not saved or anywhere near ready to join the Church, this is what he told us: "Everyone loves you, just keep coming." He didn't say, "You don't understand what we believe, so you might as well go somewhere else," or "Let's get you in the Church and we will work on the doctrine part later." He said, "Everyone loves you, just keep coming." After that, every time we headed to the Catholic church we'd been attending on Thompson Lane, we would instead make a left turn onto Foster Avenue to the Church of God. No one there asked us who we voted for, they didn't tell us how to dress or what we should take off, they just loved us.

Just before Easter that year, Brother Dupre asked us to sing a special song for the sunrise service. What was he thinking? Here were two people who just started visiting, were not saved, did not understand any of the Church's teachings, were wearing wedding rings, and he asked them to sing on Easter. It wasn't like there was no other talent at the church. David and Rita Baroni attended there as well as others, but he asked us. We decided to sing a song Laura had written a couple of weeks earlier. A song that basically said, "Lord, I need you." So, at the Easter sunrise service, we got up to sing. All I remember is when we got to the part of the song that said, "I need you more than ever. I can see there's really nothing of this world for me," the Spirit moved in. Laura set down the guitar and we fell into the altar

and cried out to the Lord. All of a sudden, we began to understand. I hardly went to church growing up, but now I wanted to be there every time the doors were opened. I never gave anything to the church growing up, but now I wanted to start paying tithes and giving more. You see, we had fallen in love with Jesus, and when you fall in love, you'll do anything for the one you are in love with. Shortly after getting saved, we were sanctified and baptized with the Holy Ghost. I ended up working with Brother Campbell and Brother Dupre pouring concrete.

That first summer, it was like attending BTI. By October of that year, Brother Dupre came to us after one service and asked, "So, when are you guys going to join the Church?" A few weeks later, we joined. That was 42 years ago. There have been good times and hard times. There have been people who have come and gone, and some who have been close friends. We have been disappointed by some people, but never by God. He has kept us and our family every step of the way. All because someone told us we were loved, so just keep coming. All because someone had the sensitivity to the Holy Ghost to ask two unqualified people to sing Easter Sunday. Pastors, my feeling is that if folks who are seeking come into your congregation, don't worry about the way they dress or what they might believe (trust me from my own experience), when God's Spirit is present, they will find what they have been looking for. Let Him lead them and you, and tell them, "Everyone loves you, just keep coming." I promise you God will take care of the rest.

THE GIFT OF DIVERS KINDS OF TONGUES

(An Unknown Tongue That Edifies the Church and the Interpretation of Tongues)

Included in the Spirit's gift of divers (diverse, different) kinds of tongues is an *unknown tongue that edifies the Church*. "I would that ye all spake with tongues, but rather that ye prophesied: for greater *is* he that prophesieth than he that speaketh with tongues, **except he interpret, that the church may receive edifying**" (1 Cor. 14:5). The apostle Paul teaches us that it's better to preach or teach the

Word of God to others so they can understand more about God and be edified than to speak in unknown tongues and the hearers learn nothing. However, Paul says if we speak in unknown tongues and the Holy Ghost uses us to interpret the message into a known language, this would be the equivalent of preaching, because the Church would understand what is said, learn, and be edified. There are times when the Holy Ghost will speak through some of us in unknown tongues so the Church will be edified. This results, or should result, in interpretation of the unknown tongues (message) from the Holy Ghost by either the one speaking in tongues or someone else. "Wherefore let him that speaketh in an *unknown* tongue pray that he may interpret" (1 Cor. 14:13).

The Scripture also gives the divine order of a message in unknown tongues and its interpretation. "If any man speak in an *unknown* tongue, *let it be* by two [in other words—it can be by two], or at the most *by* three, and *that* by course [in turn and in order]; and let one interpret"



(1 Cor. 14:27). If the Holy Ghost wants to share a message with us in a language we can understand, God's Word tells us there will be no more than three individuals to speak in an unknown tongue before the interpreted message, separately, and then one will interpret. This is per Holy Ghost message and not per Church service or meeting. If someone is disobedient and does not

give out the interpretation for a particular message, there should be no more messages in unknown tongues for that particular message. "But if there be no interpreter, let him [the one that gave out the message in unknown tongues] keep silence in the church; and let him speak to himself, and to God" (1 Cor. 14:28). If the unknown tongues have exceeded the biblical maximum of three in number, the moderator of the meeting might point this out to the congregation, and should certainly call everyone to prayer to bring things back into order.

Proper teaching about the gifts of the Spirit will help our people to avoid error, emotionalism, and the manipulation of the enemy. "And the spirits of the prophets are subject to the prophets. For God is not *the author* of confusion, but of peace, as in all churches of the saints" (1 Cor. 14:32, 33). When we order our lives and our meetings according to the Word of God, the Spirit of God will be present, and everyone will be blessed!

"Christ gathered up all the sins of those to be redeemed under His one arm and all their sorrows under His other arm and said: 'I will atone for these under my right arm. Strike me with all thy glittering shafts, O eternal Justice! Roll over me with all thy scourges, ye oceans of sorrow!' And the thunderbolt struck Him from above, and the seas of trouble rolled up from beneath, hurricane after hurricane, and cyclone after cyclone, and then and there, in the presence of earth and heaven and hell, yea, all worlds witnessing, the price, the bitter price, the transcendent price, the awful price, the glorious price, the infinite price, the eternal price, was paid that sets us free... Our great Waterloo was in Palestine. There came a day when all of hell rode up, led by Apol-

lyon, and the Captain of our salvation confronted them alone, the Rider on the White Horse of the Apocalypse going out against the Black Horse Cavalry of Death and the Battalions of the demoniacs and myrmidons of darkness. From twelve o'clock noon to three o'clock in the afternoon, the greatest battle of the universe went on. Eternal destinies were being decided. All the arrows of hell pierced our Chieftain, and the battle-axes struck Him, until brow and cheek and shoulder and hand and foot were incarnadined with oozing life; but He fought until He gave a final stroke with a sword from Jehovah's buckler, and the Commander in Chief of hell and all his forces fell

back in everlasting ruin, and the victory is ours! And on the mound that celebrates the triumph we plant this day two figures, not in bronze or ivory, or sculptured marble, but two figures of living light, the Lion of Judah's tribe and the Lamb that was slain."
